Senior Men's 18 Hole Stroke Play

- Stroke Play 100% handicap differential (using course handicap)
- Golfer 1 Handicap 10 4 = 6 (Receive 6 strokes)
- Golfer 2 Handicap 4
- All golfers <u>MUST</u> possess a current and valid GAO handicap prior to the first match. Any golfer playing a match without a current and valid GAO will automatically forfeit that match.
 - GAO handicap can be purchased in the pro shop cheaper than online.
- All golfers <u>WILL</u> play from the White Tees
- Both golfers are responsible for arranging the match well prior to the deadline
- Match <u>MUST</u> be completed by posted date
 - If neither golfer can participate in this match, the match will be determined by a two (2) out of three (3) coin flip performed by the Games Captain and his committee.
- All grievances and/or rule challenges will be directed to and resolved by the Games Captain and his committee.

Definition of Medal Play

Stroke play, also known as **medal play**, is a golf format in which the total number of strokes is counted over one, or more rounds, of 18 holes. In stroke play, the winner is the player who has taken the fewest strokes over the course of the round, or rounds.

In handicapped competitions, the players would subtract their handicaps from the total (gross) score to generate their net scores, and the player with the lowest net score is the winner.
